Family Nature Walk: Concord Land Conservation Trust's Nashawtuc Hill/Observe Birds & Native Plants SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 23, 2:00—4:00 PM

Join Peter Alden as he guides us on a family nature walk of the Egg Rock and Nashawtuc Hill Circuit!

Park on the right along Frenchman's Meadow just after the Sudbury River bridge on Nashawtuc Road. We assemble at the start of Squaw Sachem Trail. First destination is Egg Rock where the rivers join. Next the famous hemlock grove along the Assabet River. We skirt by fields and woodlands on a wide trail counter-clockwise past many fruiting trees, shrubs and vines with frugivorous birds. Return is along Musketaquid Road and Sudbury River meadows.

As an outdoor event, the weather may impact the date.

"What's the Rush? The Solution to the Biodiversity Crisis," from Homegrown National Park WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 27, 6:30—8:00 PM Goodwin Forum, Main Library

Bring your friends and neighbors! Join us during Climate Prep Week to view Doug Tallamy's "What's the Rush?" video, and find out what you can do in your own yard to regenerate biodiversity. Tallamy is Professor of Entomology and Wildlife Ecology at the University of Delaware and the author of Bringing Nature Home; Nature's Best Hope; and The Nature of Oaks. His grassroots organization, Homegrown National Park®, is a non-profit dedicated to galvanizing individuals and communities to regenerate biodiversity and ecosystem function by planting native plants, with an initial goal of 20 million acres of native plantings across the United States.

The video will be followed by a chat with panelists who are already taking steps to shrink lawns, remove invasive species, add native plants, avoid insecticides, herbicides and fertilizers, reduce nighttime light pollution and more. There will be opportunities to ask questions, gather resources and learn how you can get involved and get on the map.
