Concord- The Concord Free Public Library announces its 2016 Concord Reads title and related events

In November library patrons and Concord residents were invited to vote for a book title for this year's Concord Reads. Concord Reads involves the community reading one book and attending related events during the month of March. The Concord Reads committee created a ballot with five book titles and asked the community to select their favorite. The titles included: *The Boston Girl* by Anita Diamant; *To Kill a Mockingbird* by Harper Lee; *The Martian* by Andy Weir; *The Big Tiny* by Dee Williams, and *Elephant Company* by Vicki Constantine Croke. Andy Weir's *The Martian* received the most votes. Following is the complete list of related programs hosted by the library.
