The Concord Free Public Library is an Alliance Partner with <u>Safe Routes to School</u>, a program run through the Massachusetts Department of Transportation. In this role, we support the annual Bike to School events held in October and May and Winter Walks to School in February.

We invite you to get ready for the upcoming Bike to School during the Concord Family Bike Fest! Join us and other bicycle-minded organizations on Sunday, May 4 from 1 to 3pm at Thoreau School. Try out safety courses, demo e-bikes, get a tune-up with bike repair folks, and more. Partner organizations include Bike to School Concord, the Concord Public Schools, Mothers Out Front, CCHS Green Team, and the PTGs. Bikers of all ages and abilities are welcome!





Enjoy the beautiful weather by riding your bicycle to the Library! **Bike for Books** is an all ages program that encourages energy-efficient travel by bicycle and rewards patrons with ice cream.

Bike for Books is very simple. Ride your bicycle to the Main Library or Fowler Branch Library - we encourage all ages to join in the fun! Show your helmet to staff at the Children's Library Desk at the Main Library or at the Fowler Branch Desk, and we'll keep track of your visits. CRAFTY IDEA

Some yogurt comes in a very cute 5 oz. glass jar which can be recycled, upcycled or repurposed, with or without purchased bamboo and silicone lids. You can use them to hold flowers, paperclips, spices, small indoor succulents, starter spider plants, bulbs, and candy. They can hold pudding or drink. You can also turn them into votive candles. You can embellish them with flat-bottomed glass gems, or decorate them with acrylic paint for the holidays. You can even reuse them for making more yogurt, being careful not to put them in the microwave or oven.








We are big fans of conservation biologist Doug Tallamy's books and his nonprofit, *Homegrown National Park*. In his newest *How Can I Help?: Saving Nature with Your Yard*, Tallamy guides us to support biodiversity by shrinking lawn, removing invasives, planting native species, avoiding pesticides, herbicides and fertilizers, leaving leaf litter and reducing nighttime light. He discusses frequently asked questions from his many speaking events, such as the best way to control mosquitoes, whether no mow May is worth it, the difference between native plants and cultivars and how big an oak tree has to be to host caterpillars.

Borrow the book from our <u>catalog</u> to learn the answers to these questions and many more! Join Fowler Branch in getting your yard on Homegrown National Park's <u>biodiversity map</u>. This summer, Fowler will be expanding our library pollinator garden to the front yard, thanks to a grant from the Garden Club of Concord.





Why not celebrate Arbor Day by picking up one of Peter Wohlleben's books?


