#### **EXCITING NATIONAL LIBRARY NEWS JUST RELEASED!**

A National Climate Action Strategy was unveiled at ALA Annual Conference! The American Library Association and the Sustainable Libraries Initiative created the <u>National Climate Action Strategy for Libraries</u> Implementation Guide with the goal to work to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, increase work on climate adaptation to ensure libraries are contributing to community resilience, and harness the power of education for climate justice.

Puzzle Swap: The Library purchased puzzles to make our swap even more sustainable. The new additions are made from recycled paperboard, biodegradable glue, and veggie and water based ink.

Citizen Scientist Kits: Support large-scale experiments by borrowing kits! These include Measuring Light in the Night Sky, Monitoring Air Quality, Mapping Mosquito Habitats, Exploring Biodiversity, and Observing Pollinators.

- Sustainable Concord's Climate Action and Resilience Plan is a roadmap to meet the commitments the Concord community made at 2017 and 2018 Annual Town Meetings to reduce GHG emissions 80% by 2050 and to prioritize climate resilience goals and initiatives.
- <u>Sustainable Concord Dashboard</u> covers built environment, energy, mobility, natural resources, preparedness, and greenhouse gas emissions.
