The Prichards were an important Main Street family in nineteenth-century Concord. In 2012 the library received a rich and extensive gift of Prichard family papers. This collection provides an incredible window into Concord life a century and a half ago. It offers insight into the connections of Emerson and Thoreau with their fellow Concord residents, local events and local response to regional and national events, varying attitudes toward antislavery, the fabric of women's lives, and more. Participants will examine items from the collection with Curator Leslie Wilson and will explore how these papers connect with other documentary resources among the library's collections.
