WEST CONCORD GARDENS

Harrington Park

The garden is at the end of a dirt driveway just west of the Harrington House on Harrington Avenue by the "Harrington Park" sign. Take a break at the picnic table after admiring this full-sun garden, which was planted in 2022.

Baker Avenue Boat Launch

From Route 62 in West Concord, take your first left off of Baker Avenue, and park in the lot to explore this shade-tolerant garden, started in Nov. 2021 with the removal of invasive plants overgrowing the trail. Native plants were added in 2022 with ongoing additions to protect the trail and foster continuous bloom.

Fowler Branch Library (two gardens)

Visit the backyard at 1322 Main Street to see a community-created garden started in Sept. 2022. The new front garden was prepared in the summer of 2024, with planting scheduled for June 2025. Stop inside for more information and native plant resources.

CONCORD CENTER GARDENS

Barrett's Mill Conservation Land (two gardens)

Parking and trail access is just east of 363 Barrett's Mill Road. The pollinator garden is to the left of the parking lot behind the fence. A second garden, planted in 2020, is in front of the red barn at Barrett's Mill Farm stand, 449 Barrett's Mill Road.

Department of Planning and Land Management

The pollinator garden is along the side of the building at 141 Keyes Rd. and was planted in 2021.

Heywood Meadow

To see a pollinator meadow progressively planted since 2015, visit this garden at Lexington Rd. and Heywood St., (closest to Concord Center).

Concord-Carlisle High School (two gardens)

The original garden is at 500 Walden St. up the hill from the tennis courts. CCHS Green Team students planned and built this butterfly-shaped garden in 3 phases from June of 2021 to 2023. In 2024 they prepped and planted the new front garden. For phase two in summer 2025, they will add seedlings from winter seed sow workshops.
