The Fowler Library renovation is well underway as many have seen as they drive along Main Street in West Concord. The project is going smoothly and is on schedule. The generous support of many patrons has made this wonderful project possible with over \$3,300,000 raised toward the final goal of \$3.5 million by December 2010.

### **Finish Fowler by Buying or Decorating a Historical Fowler Roof Slate**

For those who have not yet made a contribution and would like a part (and be a part) of Library history, the Library Trustees and Staff are offering 1930's original Fowler Library roof slate tiles for sale.
