Seed Planting Guide for Concord, MA



The typical frost-free growing season starts May 8 and ends September 29.

Cole crops like broccoli, collards, and kale can be direct seeded around March 27 assuming the ground can be worked, but it's better to start them indoors around February 28 and then transplant them around April 18. Do the same with lettuce and spinach.

Plant onions and potatoes around March 9. Sow peas at the same time. If the ground is still frozen, start as soon as the ground thaws. Start eggplants, peppers, and tomatoes indoors around February 28. If no further frost is predicted transplant around May 4.

For all summer vegetables (beans, corn, cucumbers, squash, watermelon, etc.) plant directly in the ground around May 8 or once the soil temperature reaches 60° F. These can also be started indoors around April 18 to give these plants a head start on their growing season.
