In the spirit of the Concord Reads theme *Making a Difference*, Stona Fitch, local author and founder of the Concord Free Press, will speak about this innovative new concept in publishing on Wednesday, March 24th at 7:00 p.m. in the Periodical Room of the Concord Free Public Library at 129 Main Street.

In 2008, Stona Fitch and other writers / thinkers founded the Concord Free Press, the world's first generosity-based publisher, which publishes original novels and gives them away in exchange for voluntary donations to worthy causes or to people in need. The first three books from the revolutionary press have raised more than \$127,000. In May, the Concord Free Press will publish *IOU: New Writing on Money*, edited by poet Ron Slate. Join us to learn more about the origins of the Concord Free Press and its potential impact on the future of book publishing.
