Musical Submission Requirements:

Applicants for the Williams Scholarship for Excellence in Music are required to submit two (2) video clips, each 3-5 minutes in length that best showcase the applicant's abilities in their primary performance area (instrument or voice). The clips must clearly feature the applicant performing two works that contrast in style or tempo. The applicant may perform alone or accompanied by a pianist or ensemble. Clips of the applicant performing as a member of a group in an orchestral or choral setting, theatrical production or group ensemble will not be accepted.

Upon submitting your intent to apply for a Charles Williams Scholarship (Step One), each applicant should have received a link to a dedicated Google folder. Each applicant should upload all required artistic submissions and letters of recommendation to this folder. As a reminder, when all uploads have been submitted, send an email to Williams@CFPLCorp.org notifying us that your application submissions is complete.
