Artistic Submission Requirements:

Digital Submission: Applicants for The Williams Scholarship for Excellence in the Visual Arts are required to submit digital images of their work for review and consideration by The Williams Committee. Upon submitting your intent to apply for a Charles Williams Scholarship (Step One), each applicant should have received a link to a dedicated Google folder. Each applicant should upload all required artistic submissions and letters of recommendation to this folder. As a reminder, when all uploads have been submitted, send an email to Williams@CFPLCorp.org notifying us that your application submissions is complete.

The format for submissions will vary depending upon the artists medium and are as follows:

Animation and Short form Film/Moving Image: Submissions for animated film and short form videos shall be approximately 3 to 5 minutes in length. For animated films, the applicant must be the principal animator. For short Film/Moving Image submissions, the applicant must be the director, producer, and cinematographer of the film. A complete credit list is required for both Animation and Moving Image submissions. Please indicate whether your submission has been previously submitted to any festivals or juried competitions and specify any recognition received.

Please note: The Williams Scholarship for Excellence in the Visual Arts is not currently accepting for submission applications which include **feature-length** live action or animated films.



Ceramics: Please submit digital images of three (3) recent ceramic pieces (sculptural and/or functional). Please indicate title, dimensions and materials. Please indicate whether any of the works have been previously exhibited or submitted to any juried competitions and specify any recognition received.

Drawing, Painting, Printmaking: Please submit digital images of three (3) recent paintings, drawings, or prints. Please indicate the title dimensions and materials. Please indicate whether any of the works have been previously exhibited or submitted to any juried competitions and specify any recognition received.

Photography: Please submit digital images of three (3) recent photographs. Please provide indicate whether a digital or analog camera was used, and what method was used for printing. Composite photos and photographic videos will be accepted. Please indicate whether any of the works have been previously exhibited or submitted to any juried competitions and specify any recognition received.

Sculpture: Please submit digital images of three (3) recent sculptures. Please indicate the title, dimensions and materials (wood, metal, paper, found objects etc.).
